## **Career & Technical Education (CTE)**


BOCES CTE classes, offered primarily on a half-day basis, prepare high school students from component districts for skilled work force careers. Most CTE programs require two years to complete.

## CTE Student Performance on Perkins Indicators Who Left School in 2022-2023




#### General Educational Development Test (GED Test) For CTE Students Age 16-18 2023-2024

## **Alternative Education**

BOCES operates full-day and/or half-day programs for general-education students who have been identified as having special needs not being met in school district programs. Programs may include academics, vocational skills, work-study, specialized activities or a combination of these. The BOCES Report Card includes alternative education program enrollment and outcome data for students in grades 5 through 8, as well as students in programs leading to high school diplomas or high school equivalency diplomas.



#### **Alternative Education Outcomes**

The objective of the alternative education program is to retain students until they graduate or return to a regular school setting. Students counted as leaving programs may have done so for a variety of reasons including relocation, medical problems, childcare, incarceration or entering other education programs.

#### Adult Basic Education

#### **Educational Gain**

Under the NRS, educational gain is the primary goal for students in adult beginning/intermediate programs, adult secondary (low) programs, and in English for speakers of other languages programs. Students are counted as achieving educational gain if they exceed established reference points in their standardized test scores between enrollment and re-testing.

#### **Special Education Enrollment and Tuition**

When placing students, districts select among classrooms with different student/staff ratios consistent with each student's Individualized Education Program (IEP). The following are six of the alternatives:

- 12 students per teacher plus one paraprofessional (12:1:1)
- 6 students per teacher plus one paraprofessional (6:1:1)
- 12 students per teacher plus four paraprofessionals (12:1+1:3)
- ♦ 8 students per teacher plus 1 paraprofessional (8:1:1)
- ✤ 15 students per teacher plus 1 paraprofessional (15:1:1)
- ♦ 6 students per teacher plus 2.5 paraprofessional (6:1:2.5)


