EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION PROCEDURES

Response A – Criteria

- Incident is serious and/or life threatening
- Incident is in-progress
- **Immediate** emergency services is needed (ambulance, fire, police)

Employee Procedure

- 1. Call 911 and provide nature and location of problem.
- 2. Notify safety/security: 383-2298
- 3. Notify the building supervisor (principal or other administrator).
- *Safety/security and the building administrator have specific notifications they will make once notified of the incident. An incident command team will be formed based on the emergency plan.

Response A - Examples

- Fire Alarm
- Chemical Spill
- Gas Leak
- Environmental Problem
- Biological Hazard
- Natural Disaster
- Bomb Threat/Device

Response B - Criteria

- Incident is important, however, no immediate threat exists to persons or property
- Incident is **not** in progress
- No <u>immediate</u> need exists for emergency services (ambulance, fire, police)

Employee Procedure

- 1. Notify safety/security: 383-2298
- 2. Notify the building supervisor (principal or other administrator)

*The incident command team will make decisions regarding the situation and what notifications to make.

Response B - Examples

- Trespass
- Power Outage
- Stalking

BASED ON AN ASSESSMENT OF THE CONDITIONS – DECIDE WHETHER A RESPONSE A OR BE IS APPROPRIATE (SEE CRITERIA ABOVE)

- Suicide Threats/Attempts
- Mental Health
- Out of Control Behavior (using restraints)
- Disorderly Behavior (if in progress on road, follow procedures)
- Theft/Break-in
- Medical Conditions/Illnesses
- Accidents
- Weapons
- Assault/Rape
- Drugs (if medical needed, major quantities involved or a threat exists, use Response A)
